FRIDAY APRIL 2ND

People on the autism spectrum see, hear, and experience the world differently.

Trying to cope with the everyday can cause stress and anxiety and prevent people on the autism spectrum from fully participating in the world around them – leading to feelings of isolation and exclusion.

Differences in social communication, strong interests and repetitive behaviours mean interacting with others can often be unpredictable and confusing.

Being over or under-sensitive to sounds, touch, tastes, smells or light can cause sensory overload and make physical and social situations challenging.

Some of Yerin staff members are participating in Walk for Autism, helping to break down the barriers that keep people excluded and provide the best opportunities for people on the autism spectrum to engage, participate and thrive in the world around them.

24 Year Anniversary BRINGING THEM HOME REPORT

On 5th April 1997 The Human Rights and Equal
Opportunity Commission delivered the Bringing Them
Home report as part of the National Inquiry into the
separation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children
from their families and raised the awareness of the
Australian public of the historical policies
of forced removals as well as ongoing impacts.
Between 1910-1970's many first nations children
were forcibly removed from their families, as a result
of various government policies. The generations
of children removed under these policies became
known as the Stolen Generations. The policies of child
removal left a legacy of trauma and loss that continues
to affect indigenous communities, families and
individuals today.

.... the past is very much with us today, in the continuing devastation of the lives of Indigenous Australians. That devastation cannot be addressed unless the whole community listens with an open heart and mind to the stories of what has happened in the past and, having listened and understood, commits itself to reconciliation.

Covid-19 Vaccination Mpdate

We are an approved vaccination provider for the COVID-19 vaccines and will be helping immunise our local Aboriginal community. Our health professionals have all Completed the mandatory training to ensure that our patients will receive the best standard of care.

HOW DO YOU BOOK YOUR COVID-19 VACCINATION APPOINTMENT?

We will be following the Phase 1b vaccination schedule.

Now that we have received the vaccine, we will let you all know when its your turn to get vaccinated. When you receive your text, please call us on 0243 511 040 to book your appointments.

Each vaccine needs two doses, each taken 12 weeks apart. You can book your second appointment after your first vaccination.

HOW TO PREPARE FOR YOUR COVID-19 VACCINATION:

Before your vaccination appointment, you should make sure your details are up to date with medicare. You can find information about how you can do this on the Services Australia website at www.servicesaustralia.gov.au.

PLEASE DO NOT ATTEND YOUR VACCINATION APPOINTMENT:

- If you are feeling unwell with fever, cough, runny nose or other symptoms that could be from COVID-19
- If you are waiting for COVID-19 test results, or have tested positive for COVID-19
- If you are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, or are in quarantine
- If you have had another vaccine in the 14 days before your COVID-19 vaccine appointment.
